VJ Day 80 - 15 August 2025

I was pleased to provide an interview for KMFM this week to outline how Sevenoaks Town Council is enabling local residents who wish to commemorate VJ Day.

VJ Day, as with other commemorative events, will stir up different memories and reflections for people who themselves had personal involvement or were close to those who did, sadly few of them are likely to be happy memories. Cllr Lionel O'Hara has a personal connection to VJ Day as his heritage is from Burma, and he was born there. His mother, who is 93 next birthday, lived through that war running from the Japanese in the jungles of Burma as a small child with her younger sister and family.

We have started to install Bob Ogley's plaques providing information about bomb sites. The first was installed at Walthamstow Hall School, seen below in a picture with the Headmistress. The second was installed at the Vine today, see the photo with Bob and the Mayor.

There is another commemorative event taking place this evening with Jessica De Giudici performing Vera Lynn classics and popular 1940 songs at the Bandstand on the Vine starting 6 pm until 8 pm. Complete our survey about the transfer of local assets

The government's plans for Local Government Reorganisation are moving forward as the government says, 'At Pace'. Sevenoaks Town Council are not involved in the future of Kent County Council or Sevenoaks District Council, this is for them to agree plans with the government. However, the Town Council is very concerned about the future of local community assets which makes living, working and visiting Sevenoaks the town it is.

The Town Council already operates many community facilities but there are some which belong to Sevenoaks District Council and the concern is that when the District Council ceases to exist, these assets will automatically move to a new Unitary Authority who will be a considerable distance away and is likely to be overwhelmed with social care responsibilities and unable to have the capacity to worry about local parks or markets etc in Sevenoaks.
