- **246.** Cllr Granville welcomed Cllr Pett and Rodger Lee and thanked them for attending and their interest.

- **250.** Minutes of the meeting held on Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> October 2024 It was agreed to receive and accept the minutes of the meeting as a true record.

# 251. STNP Sevenoaks Cultural Quarter Strategy

It was noted that the Sevenoaks District Arts Council was planning to form a group to look at the impact of visual arts in the Sevenoaks District, and focusing on the proposed SDC development of Land East of the High Street. The following matters were commented on in particular:

# 1.4- Animating the Public Realm

Cllr Alan Pett mentioned that there had been a range of visual arts exhibitions over the summer, such as the Heart of Kent Hospice project in Maidstone with the "Shaun the Sheep" trial around the town and welcome similar projects in Sevenoaks District.

It was noted that the Town Council had placed an item for consideration on planning applications that fall within the Cultural Quarter. "How will the planning proposal enhance the Sevenoaks Cultural Quarter, as defined in the Sevenoaks Town Neighbourhood Plan?"

It was agreed that SDAC would review the STC Cultural Strategy Action Plan and Consider Projects for partnership working in the future.

# 2.1- Creative Workspace

Cllr Layne noted that there were a number of vacant shops within the Cultural Quarter. It was mentioned that these could be used for displaying artwork by local artists, either by using the shop interior as a display floor or using the exterior/ windows and having rotating exhibitions. It was noted that the landlords of the building would need to be consulted especially with the use of interior spacing due to handover periods.

SDAC noted that the Library, Museum and Gallery being set away from the High Street created a feeling of separation between Art and the High Street. It was noted that within the Master Plan and the STNP, there was consideration to move this closer to the High Street.

It was agreed to add to the STC Cultural Strategy Action Plan 1.4 to encourage partnership between landlords and artists for STC aspiration of unused buildings.

# 1.3- Connecting Routes

It was noted that wayfinding remains an issue within the town with, for example, many Sennockians not knowing where the art gallery is located. It was mentioned that in past projects had used recognized symbols for venues to help navigate to certain locations within the town.

Sevenoaks Town Council had applied to the District Council for CIL funding for a Wayfinding scheme but had been unsuccessful. However, if the Business Improvement District (BID) proposal was successful, it was thought it may be able to help improve wayfinding.

# 252. VE Day 8<sup>th</sup> May 2025

The Working Group received a brochure detailing the national guidance proceedings for VE Day which would be held on the 8<sup>th</sup> of May 2025. It was noted that a beacon lighting would take place at 21:30hrs and in the guidance it was suggested that fish and chips be made available during the event.

Members suggested items they would like to see to commemorate the event:

- Photo exhibition of Sevenoaks during VE Day in 1945 at the Bat & Ball Station
- Consider placing the green arch at the Vine as has been done in previous years
- Having a dress parade for young people to take part in

• Arranging talks by Mathew Ball on the History of Sevenoaks during the War

It was noted that many residents' associations and other groups within the town may hold their own events on the day. The Chair noted that the Eynsford Concert Band had expressed an interest in performing at the Bandstand during the event.

# 253. Sevenoaks in Bloom 2025

It was suggested that during the Sevenoaks in Bloom, artistic flare could be added by asking local artists and/or schools to create displays that match the chosen theme. Potentially Celebrating Bugs! (tbc). These would be displayed in the flower beds around the town.

## 254. Art In June Project

Cllr Layne reported that it was hoped to hold the Art in June Project again in the new year but noted that to do this they would need a large space for a series of days for artists to display their work (in the past this was done within private residences).



# Background to the Vision for a Thriving Cultural Town (see STNP document for full details)


The Sevenoaks Town Neighbourhood Plan (STNP) covers many important topics. During the creation of the STNP it was believed that a cultural strategy was needed within the STNP to create a Vision for a thriving cultural town for the future. The STNP and its appendices including the Cultural Vision was successful at a public referendum in May 2023 and is now a statutory planning document providing recommendations and guidelines for the development of Sevenoaks.

Arts, culture and creativity can help a town to feel welcoming, enhance the public realm and support the growth of a creative community. In Sevenoaks Town we are prioritising the following focus areas:



The Cultural Quarter Vision focuses on a diamond shape geographical area and incorporates the current cultural facilities – The Vine event space and bandstand, Environmental Park and Amphitheatre, The Space at Sevenoaks School Performing Arts Centre, The Stag, Knole House, Knole Conservation Studio, Kaleidoscope Gallery – Museum, Library and Art Space, Leisure Centre, Knole Academy School, Adult Education Centre, Bat & Ball Station (restored heritage building and event space).

The Cultural Quarter Vision was created in consultation with various cultural groups within the town.



### **Policy Principles**

The ambition to strengthen culture focused around a cultural quarter hub in Sevenoaks Town is consistent with local policy within the (SDC) Sevenoaks Local Plan, (STC) STNP and (KCC) The Kent Cultural Strategy Inspirational Creativity Transforming Lives Everyday 2017 - 2027.

#### **STNP** Themes

There is exciting potential for culture to support delivery of all seven themes in the STNP, with a particular focus on promoting the following objectives within a Cultural Quarter:

- Welcoming Gateways
- Sustainability & Green Environment
- Creative Enterprise
- Character, Heritage & Identity

- Health & Wellbeing
- Creative Skills
- Enhanced Community Assets


#### STC - Background to involvement in Arts & Culture in Sevenoaks

STC does not normally initiate its own and arts and culture projects unless it is connected to its current project and initiatives.

STC aims to act as an enabler where resources are available to enable those experienced in the arts and culture to provide these community activities.

This can be via

- Events
- Grant Funding
- Bands on the Vine Thursday evenings & Sunday afternoons during summer
- Promotion of cultural events via road banners, leaflets, Town Crier
- Stag continued investment
- Literary Festival sponsor, free double page coverage in Town Crier
- Summer Festival sponsor, free double page coverage in Town Crier
- Public Art murals, Infinity project
- Exhibitions various, sponsored and enabled.
- Children's art competitions
- Providing venues and licensing e.g. Premises Licence for Vine and Bandstand, Premises Licence for Town Centre for Summer Festival.
- Cultural Strategy planning for the future.
- Input in planning e.g. walkway in new (Tesco) development to enable provision for similar to attached.
