Youth Councillor Caitlin Stevens, as Vice Chairman welcomed all to the meeting

1 ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN

Nominations and reasons for standing to become the new Chairman were given by Youth Councillors Alexander Dunn, Caitlin Stevens, Harriet Linley and Tanjinna Miah. A vote was then taken.

RESOLVED that Youth Councillor Alexander Dunn be duly elected as Chairman.

2 ELECTION OF VICE CHAIRMAN

Nominations and reasons for standing to become the new Vice Chairman were given by Youth Councillors, Caitlin Stevens, Harriet Linley, Oliver Harper and Tanjinna Miah. A vote was then taken.

RESOLVED that Youth Councillor Oliver Harper be duly elected as Vice Chairman.

6 Finance Report

The newly elected Treasurer, Youth Councillor Harriet Linley reported the net balance to be £1,877.23.

6 KCC Youth Advisory Group Meeting (YAG)

Youth Councillor Alexander Dunn reported that all areas need to improve marketing, with more activities for girls, more adverts for local cinemas.

NOTED that Ms Katie Shipton at the HOUSE in the Basement Youth Café is organising a Beauty event to be held on 22 January 2014.

7 EVENTS

Thorpe Park Trip - this was cancelled due to insufficient take up.

8 FAIRTRADE

a) Summary of meeting held on 23 September 2014

Youth Councillor Harriet Linley requested all to "like" Fairtrade on Facebook, noting that the aims of the site are to raise awareness of the Sevenoaks Fairtrade Networking work and advised all that Sevenoaks Youth Council has been asked to hold an event during the national Fairtrade Fortnight being held Monday 24 February to Sunday 9 March 2014.

a) Ideas were discussed.

RESOLVED that the Fairtrade Fortnight event be taken to the next meeting of the KCC YAG Meeting. A date is yet to be confirmed.

9 SHOPS IN SEVENOAKS

I want to make a change for the youth all around Kent and I want their voices to be heard if they have a problem.

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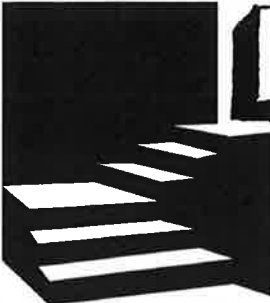
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HOUSE IN THE Basement

November 2013

1. Overview

The Youth Café is now the social area that was always intended with a good mixture of young people coming to mix with friends and spend their leisure time in safe and happy atmosphere. Obviously some young people continue to have problems and social issues that are addressed or steered towards professional services, in a discreet manner.

2. Marketing

Members of staff will be handing out flyers at the Christmas Lights Switch on event and an arrangement has also been agreed to advertise within the Stag during the pantomime season. We are also going to be publishing a Case Study document featuring some individual stories of remarkable young people the café has had the privilege of working with. We hope to have this to share at the next meeting.

3. Programme & Projects Update / Progress

- i) Katie will be arranging a Beauty in the Basement Pamper Evening for girls 11- 18 on 22nd January 2014
- ii) The Stag have kindly donated a glass cabinet to enable the display and sale of second hand computer games – it is hoped to launch this soon
- iii) An inter school chess championship is to be started soon. Sevenoaks School have kindly offered to help with the administration for this. The date is Saturday 25th January
- iv) Christmas dinner for HitB 21st December 2013. Due to the generosity of Cllr Crabtree, from her KCC Member Grant (£400) and the Royal Oak Hotel it will be possible to provide a sit down dinner and gifts for young people and volunteers at the youth café
- v) The 'Demo Booth' song recording project which is linked to the Saturday Free music lessons and funded from KCC Youth Opportunity fund has recorded a number of young people now. One unexpected surprise is a song recorded by HITB staff at the café was played last week on BBC Kent Radio's new music show. This was for a song by young person Leoni (17 years) who otherwise wouldn't have had access to

recording time. The Demo booth will continue to run alongside the Saturday free music lessons and being developed alongside on-going work with young people who attend the café]

- vi) The Youth magazine editorial team made up of young people have had two meetings now and there is going to be a joint editor post for two girls who attend K College and are studying English. Last month guest journalist from the Vine Magazine Sian Lloyd came to inspire team with her own stories and in January we have Caroline Atkin of formally successful family and children magazine who has offered her support to the project. We are still chasing the Chronicle about weekly publications of articles by young people with the magazine branding and logo. The revised date for publication is spring 2014 with a view of printing 8000 physical copies to be distributed in the local schools. We currently have 40 articles written by young people and are still accepting entries. The vision is for the youth editorial team (YET) to be mentored by professional journalists. The YET also agreed an online blog would be a great way leading up to physical magazine publication.
- vii) National Trust Youth Engagement Worker – Knoles house have recently employed Youth engagement worker called Alex Proctor who will be spending one session a week at the café and will be partnering with us on the youth magazine as well as agreeing to co-host a quiz event at the café with a provisional date being Friday March 21st 2014.

4. Staffing

Although the funding was approved by KCC for the apprentice under the Assisted Apprenticeship scheme the candidate no longer wanted the position as he has moved away from the area. We are looking for a replacement

5. QES Computer System (KCC)

From April – August retrospectively figures have been entered into the system under 'anonymous'. It is understood that the Youth Café will not receive 'points' for anonymous entries. For September and October where details are known they have been entered.

Retrospectively details relating to objectives, outcomes, photographic evidence, comments from young people will need to also be added.

It is still work in progress, however a considerable amount of set up has been done and it should be easier to progress in the future.

Unfortunately of the 122 daily entries for July, August and September, two thirds for July and August have been lost in the system. KCC tested the system but cannot identify the fault at present. STC staff are reluctant to add further information in case this happens again. However note at the same time we fall behind again and are still not able to fully use the system to its best advantage.
