It was noted that there were insufficient Youth Councillors present to hold the meeting officially, mainly due to exam season. The agenda was discussed to be ratified at a future meeting.

Hannah Patton the Youth Participation Worker for Kent County Council introduced herself and the work she was responsible for.

31. Minutes of the Previous Meeting held on 16th March 2016

It was noted that since the meeting the Head Teacher of the Weald of Kent Grammar School had provided the following comment: *"I can't remember having such useful feedback before. Many thanks for forwarding the information about school meals and PSHCE."*

The Minutes were noted as correct.

32. Finance Report

It was noted that the Youth Council balance was £1,995.44. The balance included the annual grant from the Town Council of £500.

33. Train Costs for 16 – 18 Year Olds

A copy of the survey was circulated relating to public transport costs for young people aged 16 – 18 in full time education or an apprenticeship scheme. The British Youth Council had agreed to support the survey by providing sharing a link to its own newsletter.

It was also agreed that the Southeastern Rail Travellers Association and the Kent County Youth Council would assist with circulating the survey.

Once information was received the data would be shared.

34. Driving Awareness Session

It was noted that there were still spaces available for the Driving Awareness Session for Young People to 'practice' their driving skills. The event was being held at the Community Centre on Saturday 28th May 2016. Sam Chard stated that he would like to attend. It was noted that he would attend as one of 'the organisers'.

14 completed surveys had been received to date from young people.

Correspondence had also been received from Greatness Residents Association which was read out. The email stated that they were not in favour of a Youth Shelter in Greatness Recreation Ground and that it was a waste of public money.

Those present were disappointed by the comments received from the Resident Association as Youth Shelters were considered commonplace pieces of equipment for recreation grounds and parks, Dunton Green being used as an example.

It was agreed to

- b) Forward the email from the Resident Association to Councillors present.

38. Events

The Youth Council had tried to arrange a musical event as part of the Sevenoaks Summer Festival however this had proved impractical. A further idea had been to hold a music event on the last day of term at the Vine. Young people traditionally gathered at the Vine on the last day of term. The music event would formalise this, provide entertainment and supervision.

Michele and Sandra from The Lewis Project introduced themselves and provided information about the music project. The Lewis Project would like to help with the event.

Discussion took place about the recent incident involving a large number of young people on the Vine and subsequent arrests. It was agreed that this one off incident should not discourage a properly managed event being arranged.

The following outline proposal was agreed:-

Youth Council: Road Code – Awareness Course Saturday 28th May 2016

Sevenoaks Youth Council together with Young Kent held a Road Code: Driving Awareness Session, with 9 young people in attendance:

The Trainer held discussion groups, enabled games to be played, showed presentations and films. In-between each skill learnt, Young People took part in interactive sessions using their hazard perception on simulators to become more confident on the roads and to speak up as a passenger.

In 2013:

- over 2800 young people were seriously injured in Road Traffic Accidents
- 85 young people died

Sevenoaks Youth Council

Sevenoaks Youth Council was created in 2008 and consists of 16 young people working voluntarily on behalf of other young people. It is a younger version of the Sevenoaks Town Council which also has 16 Town Councillors.

So what can a Youth Councillor Do?

More to the point, what will the Youth Councillors do? This depends on the input from the Youth Councillors themselves.

Youth Councillors are in the wonderful position to come up with ideas, have some money with direct access to Town Councillors who can help them achieve these ideas (subject to money and legal restrictions.) Youth Councillors can arrange events, lobby for facilities etc.

Further details about Sevenoaks Youth Council

Youth Councillors need to be aged between 11 and 18 years old.

Youth councillors need to be living in (or within 5 miles) or attending school in Sevenoaks.

Youth Council meets approximately every six weeks for an hour starting at 6pm on a Wednesday.

The Youth Council has its own constitution.

The Youth Council has an annual budget of £500 and the ability to apply for additional grants from other bodies

The Youth Council currently has responsibility for the activities, menu, behavioural rules and assisting with the long term strategy of the House in The Basement Youth Café.

Sevenoaks Town Council has teamed up with Kings Ramps to repeat the successful Skatepark Fun Day that was arranged a couple of years ago.

The event will take place at the Greatness Recreation Ground at the Skateboard Park and will include

- i) Professional skaters operating the Fun Day from 11.00 a.m. – 4.00 p.m.
- ii) Three of the country's top professional BMX and skateboarders to perform
- iii) Professional MC to organise the event
- iv) Full PA system with music
- v) Competitions
- vi) Prize giveaways for young people
- vii) Gazebo
- viii) Generator
- ix) Full public liability insurance.

The cost of the event is £1,750.

It is hoped that funding for this will come from the following sources:-

£875 Community Safety Partnership
 £500 Sevenoaks Youth Council
 £375 Sevenoaks Town Council Youth Outreach Budget

It is hoped that youth agencies will also use the event as an opportunity to engage with young people on a variety of subjects.

Staffing

I am pleased to report Simon has completed his 6 month probation and is now a permanent member of staff, his future targets including making music happen within HiTB. Cali continues to bake amazing cakes which go down very well. Gail will be on holiday for 2 weeks from 11th June and unfortunately due to other staff commitments HiTB will have some closures, these will all be posted on HiTB's Facebook page at regular intervals, Gail will also post them on her Gail YW house page. Simon and Cali would both like to attend the "get it" card scheme and Gail is looking into training for them. We continue to have Sessions with Andy Watson which all the young people enjoy as well as weekly support from SAYT.

General

HiTB has joined safer Sevenoaks, and will soon be supplied with a radio which can contact other local shops/venues should there be any form of unrest in the town, it can also be heard by the CCTV staff to alert them to focus on particular camera

Numbers still remain consistent, with some nights busier than others. The evening specials remain popular as do the homemade cakes. The neighbourly scheme which started well has gone quiet, Gail has e-mailed neighbourly for assistance as she believes some floor managers are on board whilst others are not. We hope things pick up again soon. Some of the younger girls bought in some "skin pens" and had a try at skin art with some lovely results.



HiTB are having a Sunflower competition and this week we have planted different varieties of seeds to see which grows the best, Cali has donated some planters and we have some flowers and herbs to

brighten the entrance up, We still need empty tins for the wall idea. (so please collect)



We have also received a larger Trough style planter and the aim is to try and grow some vegetables that we can use within our menus.

We've had 2 young people reach 18 and Cali has done some creative icing for them on individual cakes.



Simon has been "jamming" with the two Alex's and has helped some of the girls with maths revision for their GCSE's. The Youth Council and some HiTB users are going on a driving experience course on Saturday 28th May at the community centre this run in connection with Young Kent. They will experience a driving simulator. Film Saturday has been postponed until the last Saturday in July and a tally chart and Facebook "like" will be put in place to vote for the film of choice. Unfortunately letters have had to be sent out to two young people to remind them of acceptable behaviour and consideration of others whilst using the café, both parties involved have since apologised to all staff and young people involved. 3 young people gained some valuable work experience when helping out with teas and coffees for the Business and wellbeing events held in the Stag Plaza, all were extremely pleased about earning some money for themselves.

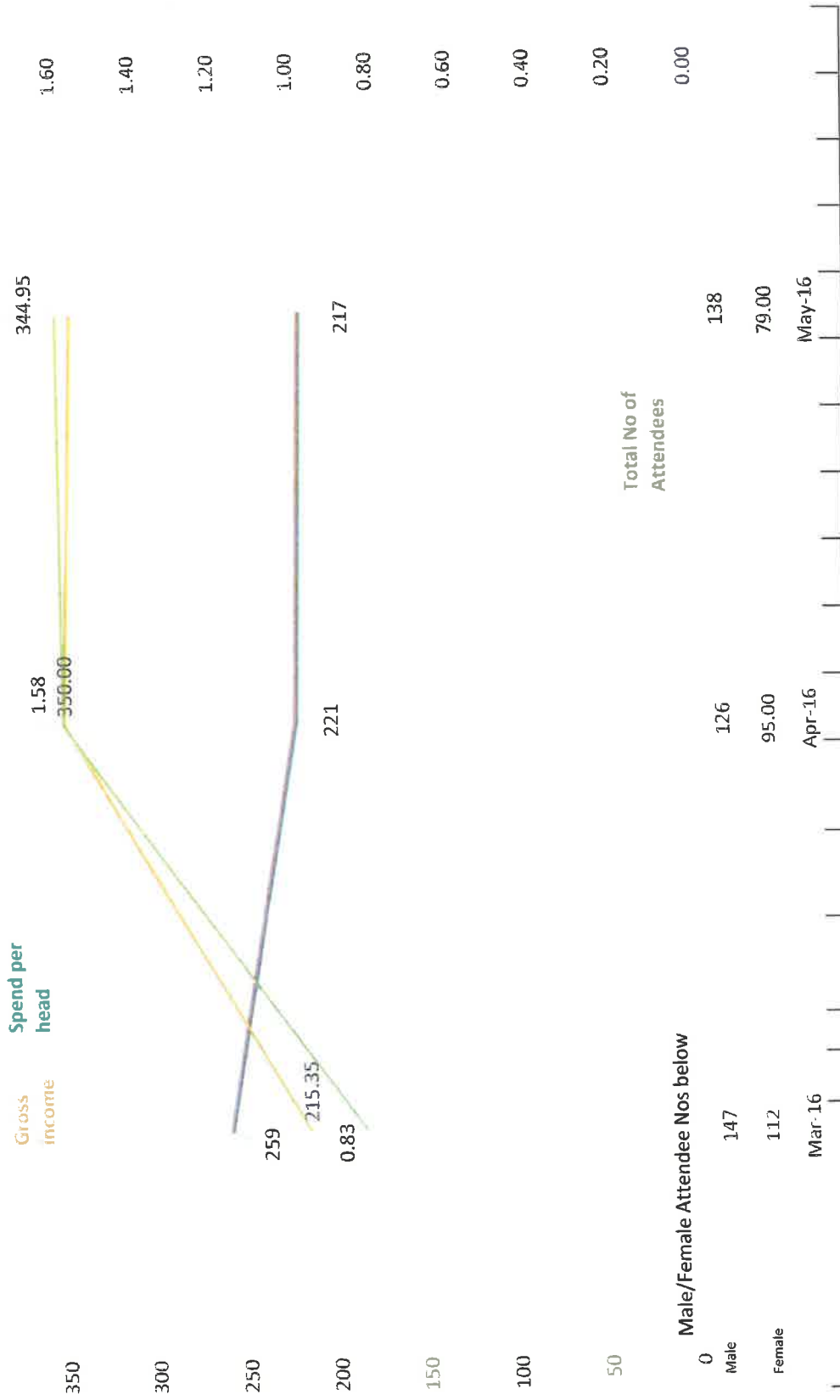
