Presentations:

A. Mr Andrew Wilmore, Sevenoaks Greensand Commons Project Development Officer

Andrew, representing the Greens and Commons Heritage Lottery Fund [HLF] Project Steering Group, advised that he is currently working together with the Deputy Town Clerk and the Open Spaces Manager. A stage one HLF Grant of £65,900 had been secured. It was hoped to secure a stage two bid for a further grant of £700,000 from the HLF. Information can be obtained from the website, <http://www.kentwildlifetrust.org.uk>, Facebook and twitter. Andrew invited the Youth Councillors to complete a feedback form and comment on aims for the future of Sevenoaks Common:

- a. to empower community to make a difference environmentally
- b. to uncover history of ancient woodlands, manorial wasteland, public rights
- c. discover sites, clear pathways to provide public access and sunlight for regeneration of plants
- d. to fell trees, record ancient trees, map routes to encourage exploration of sites

Stage two would enable ecological surveys, potentially money for any projects the Youth Council wish to help with, education projects with schools. Handout and feedback questionnaire attached as **APPENDIX A**

B Ms Kate Craib, Youth Services Manager, West Kent Communities

Kate summarised that West Kent Housing had been awarded the Youth Provisions contract for Sevenoaks District from Kent County Council and handed out a model of how this would work for the 6 areas, attached as **APPENDIX B**.

Kate had noticed the three 2017 Youth Council projects and offered assistance with

- the Open Mic nights
 - Summer festival proposal and invited Youth Councillors to the Edenbridge Festival on 18th April 2017. The Edenbridge theme comprises mental health awareness, drugs and alcohol and music with evening workshops including meditation workshops and food
 - Graffiti Art and advised the Eden Centre have hired a local artist
1. Kate also asked if there was a need for a Youth Forum to be set up in Sevenoaks generated by Youth people and asked the Youth Councillor's to contact her with thoughts about this.

RESOLVED: to note the reports. Youth Councillors to advise Michèle MacDonald if interested in the Volunteer Programme.

NOTED: the Town Clerk advised that funds to continue running the Youth Café required serious consideration. Negotiations were ongoing. Youth workers from external organisations to support the Youth Café were also being considered. Currently there was a shortfall of £25,000 for the year 2017/2018 which could be funded financially or in kind or by increased hiring of the venue during the day.

27. PROJECTS 2017

- i) Open Mic Night – Friday 24th February 2017 - The Town Clerk advised this event follows the Youth Councillors' survey undertaken at the Christmas Lights Switch on Event on 25th November 2016. West Kent Communities offered help and support to the Youth Councillors to help deliver workshops and provide equipment and youth to support the Friday events. The Town Clerk advised that the Youth Council, Youth Café had previously shared joint projects with the Eden Centre. Mr Shane Mochrie-Cox to discuss with Knole Academy's music department. The Town Clerk advised that there would be expenditure relating to this project and reminded the Chairman, Vice Chairman and Treasurer that spends may be signed off outside the committee.
RESOLVED: Youth Councillors to liaise with their music departments. West Kent Community to meet with the Town Clerk and Committee Clerk.
- ii) Creation of public art/graffiti outside HiTB Youth Café – Youth Councillor Elise van den Hoek gave a re-cap of ideas for public art on walls. Further discussion on the bus on Monday. The wall outside the Stag leading to the HiTB had been identified initially with other locations to be found in future subject to permissions being obtained. The Youth Council suggested that a competition be the way forward with the Youth Councillors choosing the winner. Youth Councillor Elise advised her school runs Thursday Art VSU afternoons.

Mr Andrew Wilmore informed the Youth Council that Sheffield had taken digital photos of the meadows locally, held photo exhibitions and displayed natural banners around the town to link.

Youth Councillor James suggested the Sevenoaks Commons Project, Sevenoaks Summer Festival and the Graffiti Competition could all be linked in with photos of the Sevenoaks Commons regarding material, banners linking differing areas within the town.

Youth Councillor Katie Willis suggested art on pavement.

- b. Youth Councillors contact School Art Departments
 - a. to collect applicants and raise awareness of the competition
- c. To paint if possible time to link into the Youth Council's proposed festival.
- d. Potential project - Long term to link from Stag to the Sevenoaks Museum and Library via public art.

iii) Arranging a Summer Festival

RESOLVED: to take place on the Vine Bandstand with Open Mic Night performers to attend. To discuss further on the Coach Trip to the Houses of Parliament on Monday 30th January 2017.

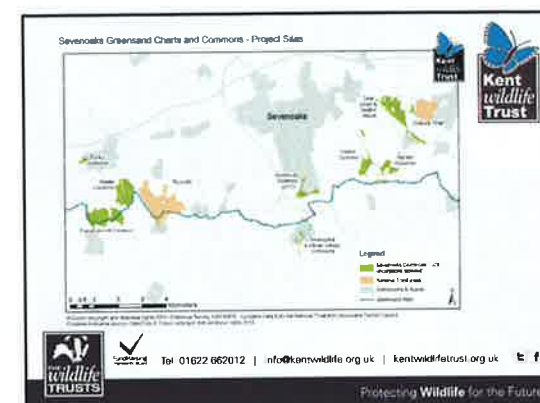
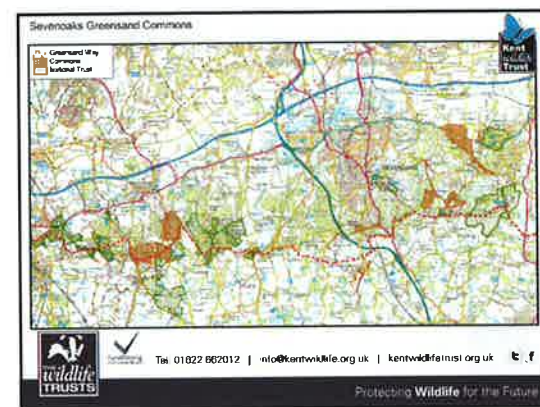
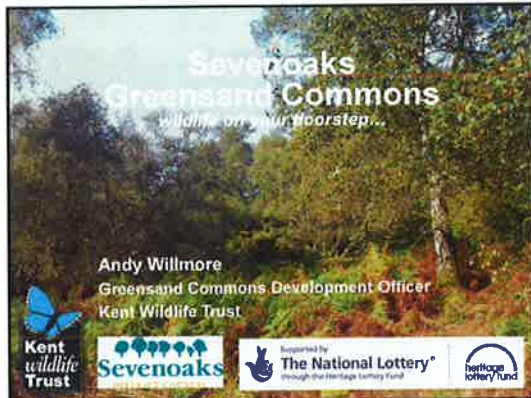

Where are the Greensand Commons?

The Westerham cluster (159ha) includes:

- Hovey Common
- Farley Common
- Crockhamhill Common

The Sevenoaks cluster (115ha) includes:

- Bitchet Common
- Fawke Common
- Seal Chart and Redhill Wood
- also the small Sevenoaks and Weald Common (41ha) used as a village green

All managed by Sevenoaks District Council since 1995 under a Scheme of Management

Sevenoaks Common (18ha) managed by Sevenoaks Town Council

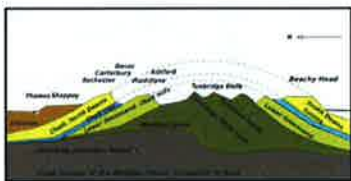
Site designated Site of Special Scientific Interest and a Local Nature Reserve – ancient woodland and heathland of high health

Located within the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty

What are the Greensand Commons?

- **Agistment:** Right to pasture cattle, horses, sheep
- **Turbary:** Right to take sods of turf for fuel
- **Common of Marl:** Right to take chert, sand and gravel
- **Pannage:** Right to turn out pigs for a period in autumn to eat mast (beech mast, acorns and other nuts)
- **Estovers:** Right to take sufficient wood for the commoner's house or holding, usually limited to smaller trees, bushes and fallen branches. 'By hook or by crook'

What are the Greensand Commons?



- Areas remained on plateau, where left as very stony, slightly acidic, impoverished soils
- Easy to clear, very hard to farm

What are the Greensand Commons?

- First colonists to Britain probably travelled along ridges:
- Iron Age Hill forts; e.g at Oldbury and by Crockhamhill Common
- Romans reputed to have made camps (One Tree Hill, Oldbury) – control iron trade
- Jutes were first 'Anglo-Saxon' invaders
- Jutes settled to the north – Vale of Holmesdale
- Rise of great estates
- Development of 'Commons' on 'Manorial Wastes'
